

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As strange as this may sound, 2019/20 was a great year for the Club – I can say this as our financial year finished in March and we missed the onslaught of Covid-19. While it now seems a world away, we achieved many things as a Club during the year. We hosted the National 10,000m Championships, our own races, the Box Hill Classic and Whitehorse Twilight which saw record numbers, we upgraded the gym, as well as developing our Track Restoration Plan. We also sadly saw the passing of one of our greatest athletes Graham Crouch.

Restoration Plan for the Track

The Box Hill Track is an outstanding facility but there are some key areas that need to be fixed. The terraces need to be rebuilt, we need shade structures, a new pole vault runway, general landscaping, and a lighting upgrade.

The Committee developed a Restoration Plan that was presented to the CEO of Whitehorse City Council earlier in the year.

We were delighted that Council immediately responded and rebuilt one of the terraces, as well fixing up the drainage, and general landscaping. The next stages are being costed in put into the Council budget requests.

Gym upgraded

The Club also upgraded the gym with almost all new equipment. Big shout out to Simon Watson for overseeing the project.

Box Hill Classic and Whitehorse Twilight – Record numbers

These events are the T20 of athletics and are booming. In their third year, we had record numbers - so much so we may have to restrict numbers next year. Stephen Dinneen needs to be congratulated for being the driving force behind these meets, but also the support of all the Committee, coaches and athletes.

Given the on-going success of these events, we are aiming to launch a third event, the Box Hill 5k Burn.









Zatopek – Race of the year

To cap off the season, Box Hill hosted the Zatopek 10,000m National Championships. This was arguably the best athletic meet in Australia over the year.

Spectators crowded around the track to cheer on **Stewart McSweyn** as he broke the National record. These records are typically set overseas in places such as London, Rome, Paris, but now Box Hill takes its place.



Success on the Track

The Club exists to support its athletes, and we have a very strong base of established and emerging athletes.

On the national stage, Box Hill athletes **Nana Owusu-Afriyie** (4x100m relay) and **Georgia Griffith** (1500m) represented Australia at the World Athletics Championships in Doha in 2019. **Harry Summers** (10,000m) was selected but could not compete due to injury.

Underpinning the success of these athletes are their coaches and a big shout out to **Tony Marsh** (Nana) and **Steve Ellinghaus** (Georgia).

WINTER REPORT 2019

Although Box Hill were not as dominant as it has been in recent years, we still had our fair share of success this winter season.

Our men's Premier Division team failed to win its fourth consecutive premiership, but the club still won three premierships and achieved two 2nd place finishes in the XCR'19 cross country and road racing season.

Despite team victories in the 8km and 10km cross country events and at the Sandown road relays, luck was against us in some of the other events (Harry Summers taking a wrong turn while leading in the Ekiden relay, Michael Dowel falling ill and vomiting during his leg in the cross country relays, the cancellation of the 12km cross country event due to flooding of the course) and our team finished in a creditable 2^{nd} position.

Individual highlights included victories by Harry Summers in the Victorian 10km cross country championships at Bundoora and in the 10km road championships at Albert Park. Andre Waring picked a silver medal in the 15km road race at Lake Wendouree.

After a disappointing season in 2018 that saw our women's team was relegated to Division 2, the team bounced back to easily claim the premiership and win promotion back to the Premier Division for 2020. This premiership was a real team effort and congratulations to Courtney Powell, Marlie Campton, Steph Kondogonis, Katherine Foley, Jessie Muirden, Elizabeth Doueal, Julie Norney, Lucy Buckley, Pia Hunter, June Petrie, Rachel Johnson, Freya Henriksen and Amy Carrig, all of whom contributed to this success.





Box Hill masters athletes showed that they are the best in the state, with premierships to our men's and women's teams in the 50+ divisions. The women's team of Julie Norney, Pia Hunter and June Petrie (with help in the final event from Amanda Harper) dominated their age group, winning seven of the nine events. Julie and June were unbeatable in the age groups, winning the 50-54 and 55+ age group individual winter champion awards. John Meagher won the men's 55-59 age group award and led the team that included Tony Langelaan, Peter Stefanos, Chris O'Connor, Simon St. Hill and Michael Eury to another premiership. Box Hill athletes also produced some great results in the Victorian All Schools Cross Country Championships at Bundoora.

Ashlee Treagus won the girls U17 state title, while Doug Buckeridge (U17) picked up silver and Joshua McLeod (U20) and Jack Armstrong (U17) won bronze medals.

The other outstanding performance by a Box Hill distance runner was the brilliant win by Harry Summers in the "world's biggest fun run", the Sydney City to Surf. Harry won the hilly 14km event in a time of 40:05, just two seconds outside Steve Moneghetti's course record. Thank you to all the athletes who supported our teams this XCR season and thank you to all the parents and supporters who have been there to act as time keepers or club helpers or

have supported the team in other ways. A special thanks to lan and Megan Sloane for their help and support.

With the cancellation of the 2020 XCR season, let's hope that our runners can stay fit and motivated for even greater success in 2021.







Summer Report 2019/20 Track and Field Season

In an unusual year, with changes to interclub competition, an increase in the number of special meets and the cancellation of the national championships and the state masters championships due to the Covid-19 pandemic, Box Hill athletes continued to put in some outstanding performances

Interclub Competition

Athletics Victoria again decided to experiment with interclub competition, this year introducing AVSL (Athletics Victoria Shield League). In practice this did away with all age group competition and separate men's and women's teams. Every club member who competed in AVSL competition at any venue scored points for the club for that weekend, according to a complicated age and sex adjusted points table. Once the round was complete then each club's total points score was compared and club placings awarded for that round. Unfortunately, this system did not engender great enthusiasm and although the club had many regular competitors and some great performances, many other athletes saved themselves for special meets, miler's club or rare air events and the state championships. Athletics Essendon managed to get the most athletes out to compete in the AVSL and therefore won the premiership. Box Hill finished 4th.

2019 World Championships in Doha

The World Athletic Championships were held in Doha over September and October. Three Box Hill members earned selection in the national team for this event, Nana Owusu (4x100m), Harry Summers (10,000m) and Georgia Griffith (1500m).

There were both highs and lows from the competition. Unfortunately, the flu hit Harry just before the Championships and he had to withdraw. A dropped baton stopped the women's 4x100m literally in their tracks which was a disappointing outcome. We know Harry and Nana will be back next year after both enjoyed phenomenal seasons. In the 1500m, Georgia Griffith aggressively led for the majority of her heat to make it through to the semi-finals. In slow, tactical semi-final, Georgia was not able close in on the fast finishing pack and missed on progressing into the final.
